STORY SUMMARY

Adonai Delivers His People— Egypt has just seen seven of the ten plagues. Now the last three plagues are about to come. First comes locusts, then darkness. This will be followed by the death of the firstborn males. Adonai, through Moshe, instructs His people to take a lamb, use the blood to cover the door posts of their houses, then eat the meat in their homes with their families. By doing this, when the plague of death comes, it will not come upon them or their families. After this plague, Pharaoh lets the Israelites go. They leave in a hurray and eat bread that has not had time to rise. Adonai, through Moshe, tells the people how to remember this time every year, generation after generation. It is known as Pesach or Passover.

Word Focus

Abad- 'Slavery, servant, or bondage' To be a slave to sin means you are under sin's control. Adonai frees us from this bondage of sin so that we can live with victory over sin.

Main Message

We are redeemed by Adonai through the blood of the lamb. Yeshua became this lamb for us. Through His blood we are delivered from the Egypt of sin. One day we will again be physically redeemed into His kingdom. Meanwhile, there is a spiritual redemption from the sin that surrounds us. By claiming the blood of the lamb, we are giving Adonai authority in our lives, to deliver us from sin and make us clean. Pesach is a time of year to really focus on these things.

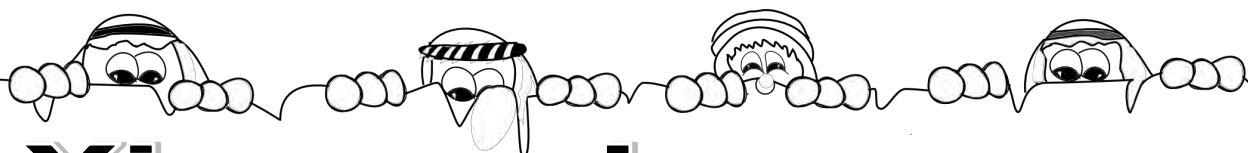

STORY SUMMARY

Egypt’s Destruction-Adonai, through Yirmeyahu, predicts how Egypt will be invaded by N’vukhadretzar (Nebuchadnezzar) of Bavel (Babylon). This is because of Egypt’s false worship and cruel treatment of Isra’el.

Word Focus

Bavel-‘Babylon’ also ‘to jumble.’ This comes from the word ‘balal.’ Bavel is also known to mean ‘the gate of G-d.’

Main Message

The Locusts plague of Egypt was greater than there ever, but this passage says the invasion from Babylon would be greater. Many times people do not learn from the past mistakes in history, and have to experience the consequences again. Egypt did not learn that Israel was special to Adonai, and He would defend them.

Unfortunately, they needed to be shown again. It is wise to take advice from people who can help save us from making bad choices. It is good to learn from history and the mistakes of others. This can save a lot of unnecessary pain.

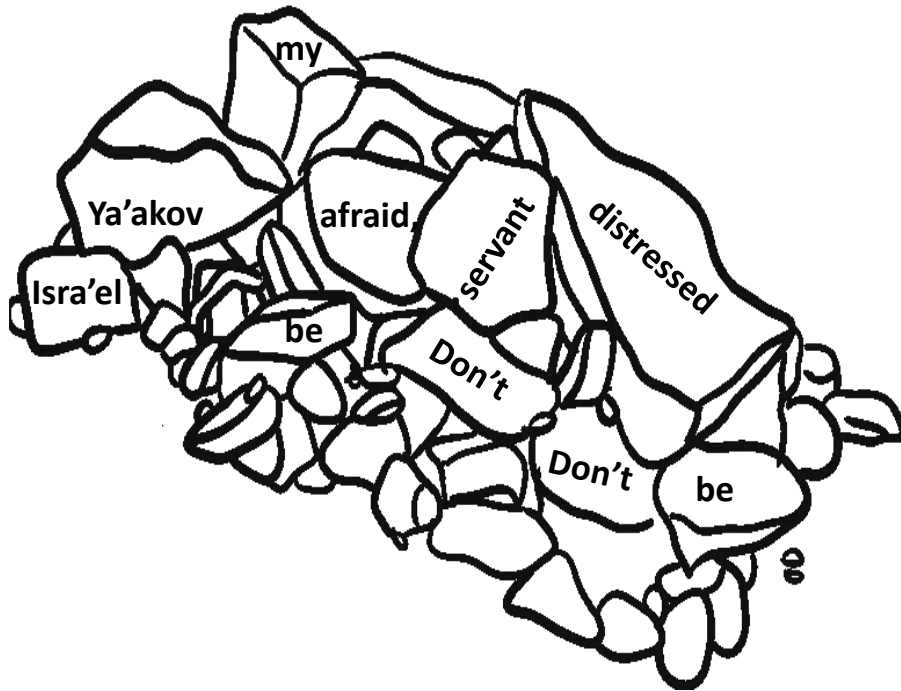

Story Summary

Yeshua the Pesach Lamb— The price paid to ransom us from a worthless life was not silver or gold, but something more precious. It was the blood sacrifice of Yeshua as the lamb. Adonai knew Him before time began and revealed Him as the Messiah, who died and was raised again. He gave Adonai all glory and inspired people to put their trust and hope in Adonai.

Memory Verse

“...But with the precious blood of the Messiah, like that of a lamb without blemish or defect.”

1 Peter 1:19 ISV

Did you Know

Adonai still wants us to remember Pesach and teach our children about it.

Main Message

The Pesach story of redemption highlight the plan of salvation by showing how Adonai has been working to redeem His people. Understanding Yeshua's blood sacrifice as the lamb, enhances our understanding of Pesach, and should lead us to appreciate this festival more, realising how much our freedom cost Adonai.

Word Focus

Kopher— ‘Ransom.’ This has the same root word as ‘atonement’, which also sums up well what the blood of Yeshua does for us.

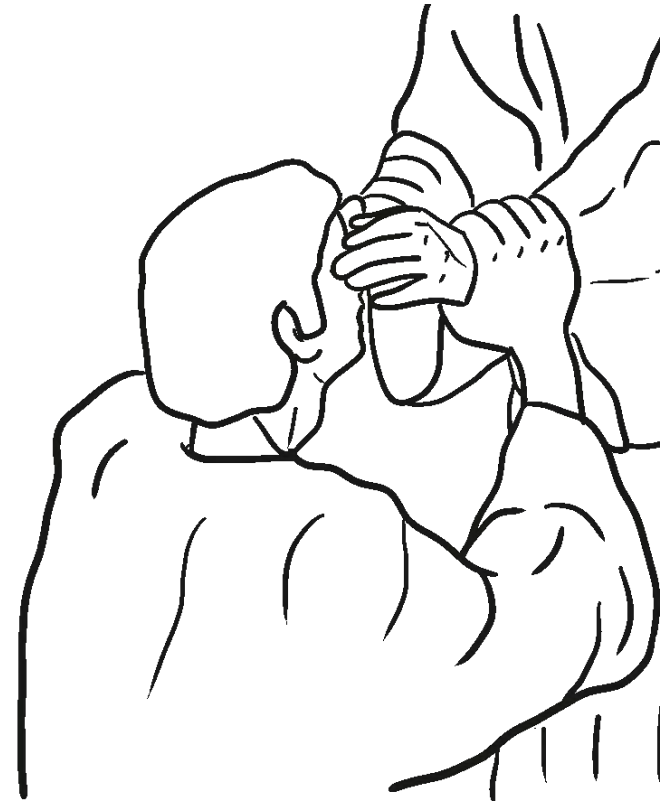
